### KOO WEE RUP'S ECHOING GREEN FELLOW

In a world first, two Australians have won Echoing Green Fellowships. One of these is Justin Matthys, who grew up in Koo Wee Rup.

Echoing Green is a global organisation dedicated to supporting young people who have a vision for helping to solve world problems. Justin's area is that of education. <a href="http://www.echoinggreen.org/about">http://www.echoinggreen.org/about</a>

Around the world, social entrepreneurs tackle the world's biggest problems. The best and brightest of these vie for the prestigious Echoing Green Fellowship; according to Harvard University, this is harder to get into than the Harvard Business School. Since its inception in 1987, no Australian has won. Until now.

Along with Richard Wilson, Justin Matthys founded Maths Pathway. http://www.mathspathway.com. They left their jobs in consulting and

astrophysics to teach in disadvantaged schools in the Teach for Australia program. It was there that they noticed a huge problem. Justin noted that students spend around 1500 hours in maths class, which should be sufficient for everyone to become confident and capable at maths, but 1 in 3 never reach basic proficiency.

When schools adopt Maths Pathway, they completely change the way they teach, using a new eLearning system, which focuses on individual rates of learning. And this appears to be extremely effective: in the dozens of schools currently using Maths Pathway, students are learning at double to triple the rate. Earlier this year, Maths Pathway was named the 6<sup>th</sup> most innovative company in the Australian SMART 100.

Maths Pathway is not doing this alone. Professors from The University of Melbourne act as academic advisors. Currently, Maths Pathway is running a pilot alongside the Mathematical Association of Victoria (MAV). On the technology side Microsoft is lending a hand, hosting web applications securely on their cloud systems.

But it's been a tough slog for Richard and Justin. Over 12 months ago they quit their jobs and have been working around the clock without pay. For the first 9 months, their 'office' was Richard's garden shed.

The Echoing Green Fellowship will help a great deal. For the first two years, they will receive funding, participate in leadership development, and connect with the powerful network of Echoing Green Fellows, partners, and friends.

"We still need help though!" Justin is quick to note. "We're currently in an investment round, but the thing we need the most are more teachers hearing about us. If any parents have children in grade 5 to 10, and their teacher isn't using Maths Pathway, let them know about it. We want all students to thrive in mathematics."

Koo Wee Rup Secondary College has been using Maths Pathway and St John's has recently come on board for the upper grades.

### THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (Edited Extracts)

The Township held its monthly meeting on Wednesday, 2 July. Township Meetings are open to anyone who would like to attend. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, 6 August at 7:30 pm at the Community Centre.



### TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (Edited Extracts) (from Page 1)

Cr Young advised on the following on-going issues:

- Potholes in the surface of the vehicle parking bay outside of the toilets in Rossiter Road are on the Shire Council's maintenance program.
- The building of toilets for the disabled at the swimming pool will now be funded by the Cochrane Park budget.
- Tables and chairs for O'Riordan Park are due to be installed in July 2014.
- The vegetation, interfering with visibility at the junction of the Princess Freeway and the Healesville Koo-Wee-Rup Road (outbound off ramp), has been clipped back.

The proposed illuminated sign outside of the Community Centre is now the responsibility of the Cardinia Shire Works Department and progress on the project is being made. The cost will be covered in the new budget.

Cr. Young reported that the Shire Council's 2014 to 2015 budget had been accepted and carried at a Shire Council meeting on 16 June 2014 after a spirited debate.

Cr. Young announced the upgrade of Island Road, Koo-Wee-Rup. The roadway surface will be asphalted in order to assist the asparagus industry in the area. At present, dust from the many vehicles using the unsurfaced road causes gross contamination of the asparagus plants. The shared cost of this project will be borne by the State Government, the Shire Council, and a special shared charge on the abutting landholders. The Shire Council will liaise with the asparagus growers and organise the work during the low season for asparagus cultivation.

The upgrade of the unsealed part of Moody Street will also be undertaken by the Shire Council. The cost will be shared by the Shire Council and the adjacent landholders.

George Fittock brought up the problem of storm water drainage in Townley Road. He said the situation became critical after the recent heavy rain. George believes that the situation could be caused by the on-going development on Denhams Road. Cr Young said that he would inform Mike Ellis, General Manager Assets & Development Services of this problem, and ask him to get his engineers to clear out the affected drains.

Gavin Brock, the president, said that it was great news that the Bendigo Community Bank had approved a grant of \$5,000 for this year followed by \$2,000 in 2015 for the Township's 'Dragline' project. Gavin added that he hoped an application to the Shire Council for a grant of \$15,000 for the same project would also be accepted.

The agricultural drainage project in the land area at the rear of the Community Centre is under way with the Shire Council's contractor Brendon Nunn now submitting his ideas on how to stop the land flooding after rain.

The inaugural meeting of the new Community Centre Hall Committee will be at 7:30 pm on 23 July 2014. The latest news is that MECWACARE will be moving out of the Hall soon. This means the freeing up of much wanted room space and storage areas.

There was no Police report presented this evening. However, Ldg. Snr. Const. Brendan Dickson sent his apologies later on and explained that he had had to attend a truck rollover on the Koo Wee Rup - Longwarry Road. He was involved there from 5:30 pm until almost 9:30 pm. Brendan sent the flowing information by email.

"It was a good month crime-wise in Koo Wee Rup. We had one burglary at the Fantastic Home and Gift shop, a theft of cash from the register at the Royal Hotel, an attempted theft of a chocolate bar from the IGA and an attempted theft from motor vehicle in Bailey Boulevard. A pretty good month with only 4 reported crimes".

George Fittock presented the Men's Shed Report this evening. George said that the recent launch of the film, telling the story of the Koo-Wee-Rup Men's Shed on DVD, was very successful and most rewarding. Approximately 50 people came along to see this professionally shot short movie. The film can be viewed at the following link: - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Tb0FWmM5ijs.

The Men's Shed mentoring program continues with 12 to 30 students involved during the next school term.

The Men's Shed membership is now 47; an excellent increase in numbers in such a short time.

All is well with the Community Garden and the produce store. Many local growers have provided seedlings to the Men's Shed for culture in the Community Garden.

Ray Brown asked George Fittock about the object of the Koo-Wee-Rup Men's Shed and the reason so much time was spent engaged with the students and youth of the town. George explained that the primary object of the Men's Shed organisation is to establish a place for men that enables social interaction, and creates activities to maintain the health and wellbeing of those men. To build a culture in the Shed where all men are welcome and where mutual respect and trust are paramount, and to become a focal point in the community for the identification of men's health issues and further actions to resolve those issues. The men run an active youth program, mentoring and teaching their life-learnt skills to young people. This results in a satisfying and educational interaction between the older and younger males of the Town. Not only that, the younger men can do things like heavy lifting which some of the older men can't do.

George Fittock presented the Maintenance Report this evening. George told the meeting that the VCAL students from the Secondary College were again seeking to undertake a town project. Last year it was a report on rubbish that had been dumped in Koo-Wee-Rup, together with a report on graffiti across the Town. George asked the meeting to think about suitable projects such as town beautification, planting, an overhanging bushes report etc. Roadside projects, including Town signage, would not be considered because of the inherent dangers to the working students. Cathy McNulty will see if there is a project the students could undertake for the Koo-Wee-Rup Fire Brigade.

George reported that the volunteer who tripped up and broke his arm whilst working at the Lions Club barbecue early on ANZAC Day morning this year is healing well and is now OK.

Although admitting the Township Committee cannot enforce any Shire Council rules, George asked if the rules concerning the responsibilities of property owners and renters for the clearing up of leaves and berries and vegetation from the frontages and footpaths of properties, could be publicised in the Town's newsletter, "Blackfish".

Frank Crameri told of the excess water after rain that lies on the pathway between Icke Road and Grange Court. Similarly, rainwater also lies on the access track from Townley Road to the park and the pathway to the kindergarten.

Gwen Lengersdorf reported bad potholes in the roadway at the junction of Boundary Drain Road and Station Street.

Gwen Lengersdorf asked about flood mitigation at the rear of her property in Boundary Drain Road. Robert Muré, the Township Committee's representative to the Melbourne Water flood mitigation group, said he would take this problem to the group on her behalf.

Robert McDonald, a resident and a retired construction engineer, expressed his concerns about excess cracking in the structure of new houses, and the wide spread cracking of road surfaces on new estates in Koo-Wee-Rup. This cracking is causing major problems and wondered whether the Shire Council made sure that the ground is properly compacted before allowing building to commence. The secretary was asked to write to the Shire Council and ask who is responsible, the Shire Council or the land developer, and what are the rules for compaction of foundations prior to the building of new houses and of roads.

Mr McDonald asserted that the problem for native bandicoots in Koo-Wee-Rup and district is the feral cat. These feral cats attack bandicoots and should be eliminated or controlled. Cr. Young said he would take this problem to the relevant Shire Council officer.

Frank Crameri resumed from last month's Township Committee meeting, his plea for ideas to improve the Town in addition to the published Koo-Wee-Rup Township Strategy Plan. In particular, the idea of a new Sporting Complex to cater for the ever increasing population of Koo-Wee-Rup. This theme was added to by Ray Brown who fully supported the proposed sporting complex, but suggested other improvements as well. For instance, the Community Centre building should be extended another bay in length with a fully equipped stage. A lively discussion took place with the

### **Environmental Measures**

As part of the Koo Wee Rup Bypass, VicRoads is protecting and re-establishing habitat for the Southern Brown Bandicoot.

Predator control and rehabilitation programs have been developed which include, fox control, replanting of habitat within the road reserve and drains using native vegetation and establishment of safe travel corridors for the bandicoots and other native animals.

The predator control program aims to reduce fox numbers in the area through a controlled baiting program on private property. Clearly marked bait stations will indicate where baits are buried and warning notices on all appropriate entry points will be displayed.

A suggestion from the floor asked if surplus land, left over after the by-pass is completed, could be used for new Tennis Courts? Cr. Young advised that any surplus land that is available is already earmarked for environmental work with the native fauna and, in some cases, such as tree planting etc., already accomplished on this surplus land.

Another questioner asked about the plans for the future of the ex-railway track now the walking track, extending from Koo-We-Rup to Lang Lang. The meeting asked the secretary to write to VicTrack, the landholders, and ask VicTrack about their construction plans and timing for this walkway extension. Brian Paynter suggested that part of the proposal should be a link from the walking track to the new recreational facility in Lang Lang.

The president, Gavin Brock, announced that the 'Gas for Koo-Wee-Rup' project, to be constructed by Envestra, would commence with the installation of the pipework in October 2014. The recently installed pipework for the supply of higher-pressure potable water will be operational in September/October 2014. Gavin said that he would personally

contact these two authorities to get the latest news of their progress in time for the August 2014 meeting of the Township Committee.

Sean La 'Brooy, representing the 'Turning Point' Church in Rossiter Road, told the meeting about his Church's activities in organising leisure time for the children of the Town. The Church intends to run a children's evening every Friday but they need a much larger venue, he said. He asked how they could book the Community Complex Hall for this time or maybe some other day. The Church charges a small fee of \$3 dollars for each child and they get 30 to 40 children attending and they all have a very happy time. Sean then described the various activities they organise for these children. Gavin Brock told Sean that the new Hall Committee will be in action very soon and now that MECAWARE will be vacating the premises, booking will be much easier. In the meantime booking of the Hall is done through the Koo-Wee-Rup Regional Health Service via Sharyn Gregory.

Robert Muré asked about the progress for the sealing of the open drains in Denhams Road. Cr. Young said that the Shire Council is still deliberating and talking to the landholders involved about the costing of this project. It is thought that Melbourne Water may be disinterested in helping with these costs so it may be that the landholders will be faced with a special shared charge for the completion of the project.






On the 21st of June 2014 the 1st Koo Wee Rup Scout Group lost a good friend and fantastic Scout Leader in Chris Burhop to cancer.



### KOO WEE RUP COMMUNITY INVITED TO HELP SHAPE NEW ARTWORK

Cardinia Shire Council is commissioning a public artwork for Koo Wee Rup, to be completed in 2015.

Council will soon select two to three shortlisted artists from applicants who have expressed interest in producing the

artwork. These artists will then engage with Koo Wee Rup residents and business owners to develop a concept for the artwork by hosting community workshops and other consultation sessions. These forums will give people the opportunity to have their say on the future artwork and help shape the creative process.


Artists will then use community input to create a concept for the project. Based on this concept, a public art committee will then select one artist to produce the artwork.

Council has a budget of \$40,000 for the Koo Wee Rup public art project. It is inviting Koo Wee Rup residents and business operators to register their interest in participating in workshops with the shortlisted artists and receiving updates on the project.

Mayor Cr Graeme Moore said he hopes many people will become involved in the creative process.

"We want the artwork to reflect their thoughts, impressions and feelings about the town as well as its landscape, culture, history and identity. The local community will play a huge part in helping create a striking artistic feature of which Koo Wee Rup can be really proud."

### GREEN WASTE COLLECTION TO GO SHIRE WIDE

All residents across Cardinia Shire can choose to access Council's green bin service from next year. The service has

previously only been available to those living in the urban and township areas.

Council appointed JJ Richards and Sons as the new green waste contractor at the Council meeting on Monday 21 July. The new collection contract starts on 1 January 2015 and bin deliveries and collections within the new areas will commence shortly after. The service will be fully funded through the Green Waste charge, which is \$129 for 2014-15.

Residents who do not currently have access to Council's green waste collection will be able to request a green waste bin for next year. This will reduce the amount of waste they send to landfill. The green waste collected within the bins is made into compost and mulch, which is much better for the environment than going into landfill. Residents wanting a green waste bin will be advised soon as to when to place their bin order. Households who do not wish to use a green waste bin will not be required to order one next year, however all residents who create green waste are encouraged to take up the service to help reduce waste to landfill.



### **KOO-WEE-RUP'S CYCLING HERITAGE**


Koo-Wee-Rup has a great sporting heritage in football, cricket and netball, but is it cycling which has produced our greatest sportsmen? In the first part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century Koo-Wee-Rup had several cyclists who competed successfully on a national and international level. In 1907 Andrew 'AC' Colvin won Australia's richest track handicap; the Austral Wheel Race. With the prize money from the race he established a longstanding bike shop in Koo-Wee-Rup. Today the Austral Wheel Race is the oldest track bicycle race in the world and is regarded as Australia's greatest track cycling event.

Andrew Colvin's success and the establishment of a cycling shop in town promoted much local interest in professional cycling and a number of cycling stars subsequently came out of Koo-Wee-Rup. In 1909 Andrew's brother Oliver won Tasmania's most prestigious cycling event, the Scottsdale Wheel Race and, over a number of years he had a series of high placings in the Melbourne to Warrnambool. Today the Melbourne to Warrnambool is the world's second oldest one day road race and is an iconic event in Australia's sporting calendar. In 1926 another Koo-Wee-Rup rider, Les Eienseidel, had a victory in the Melbourne to Warrnambool, a fantastic achievement considering he was only 20 years old at the time. Les's prize was a brand new motorcycle which was estimated at the time to be the equivalent of an average Australian's 6 month salary. Other competitors in the 1926 Melbourne to Warrnambool included Oliver Colvin (who finished second), a young Sir Hubert Opperman and, off scratch, possibly Koo-Wee-Rup's greatest sportsman Percy Osborn.


Percy Osborn had many high placing finishes in professional races throughout Australia during this period and in 1927 the fledgling Malvern Star bike company sponsored the establishment of a series of 'European style' stage cycling events. In 1928 a number of leading Melbourne newspapers and business entrepreneurs came up with the plan to send an Australian team to the the Tour de France; 80 years before Cadel Evans and the 2013/2014 GreenEdge team. The team of 4 was led by Australia's world champion and future federal politician Hubert Opperman, and included Koo-Wee-Rup's Percy Osborn. The story of the Australian team's participation in 1928 is a fantastic one, and is one of courage and performance at the highest world sporting standards. Under great adversity Percy completed every day of the 22 stages and acted as one of the lead riders for Opperman to be able to finish in a prominent position and catapult his long and famous international career. The three Australians and one New Zealander were magnificent considering their vastly inferior bikes, lack of international competition experience, and that the Australian team of 4 compared to the European teams who had an average of 10 cyclists in their heavily sponsored and well managed operations. The Australian team's French sponsor assured them that they would provide French riders as additional support for the team. These never eventuated which left the Australian team seriously disadvantaged.

While Percy Osborn's role in the 1928 Tour de France is well documented, it is less well known that Les Einseidel was selected as 'first emergency' for the team and that the Koo-Wee-Rup local community raised hundreds of pounds to try and ensure Les went as well. At the very last moment the French cycling authorities rejected Les's registration for the race and in response to Koo-Wee-Rup's pleas for his inclusion were quoted as saying "it makes no difference if they have 300 pounds or 1,000 pounds ... he is not going". The funds raised were subsequently returned to their donors except for a small amount which was used to purchase a travelling rug for Percy to take with him on his European tour. Perhaps with a second Koo-Wee-Rup boy on board, the Antipodeans may have done even better.

On a world stage the 1928 Tour de France is notable, as it was the first time a completely non-French speaking team competed (Percy's Australian accent and humour is referred to in many reports) and was the start of the internationalisation of major world sporting events. The efforts and trials and tribulations of the Australian team after each gruelling stage was reported daily in the Melbourne press.

Percy's persistence and determination were key in his sucess; in Sir Hubert Opperman's autobiography 'Pedals, Politics and People' he remembers the first time he saw Percy ride: "the seat of the saddle stamped him definitely as rural ... he was a farm boy from Koo-Wee-Rup ... his name was Percy Osborn and against the wind he had the strength of a Brahmin bull".

After the 1928 Tour de France Percy lived and worked in Koo-Wee-Rup for the rest of his life, and died while a resident at Koo-Wee-Rup's Killara hostel .

Sir Hubert came to Koo-Wee-Rup on a number of occasions to talk about his international cycling career and to celebrate Koo-Wee-Rup's contribution to the famous 1928 Tour de France.

There are a number of photos and associated memorabilia that pay tribute to Koo-Wee-Rup's cycling heritage at the Koo-Wee-Rup museum including a magnificent photo of the Australian team when they were in France in 1928 and a montage of the 1907 Austral Wheel Race which was held in front of 10,000's of spectators at the MCG.

The Koo-Wee-Rup Swamp Historical Society meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 7.30pm at Mallow house in Rossiter Road, corner of Henry Street. New members welcome.
